

Buttercup Miniatures - Project for 1:12th and 1:6th Scale Letter kit 1910-1914



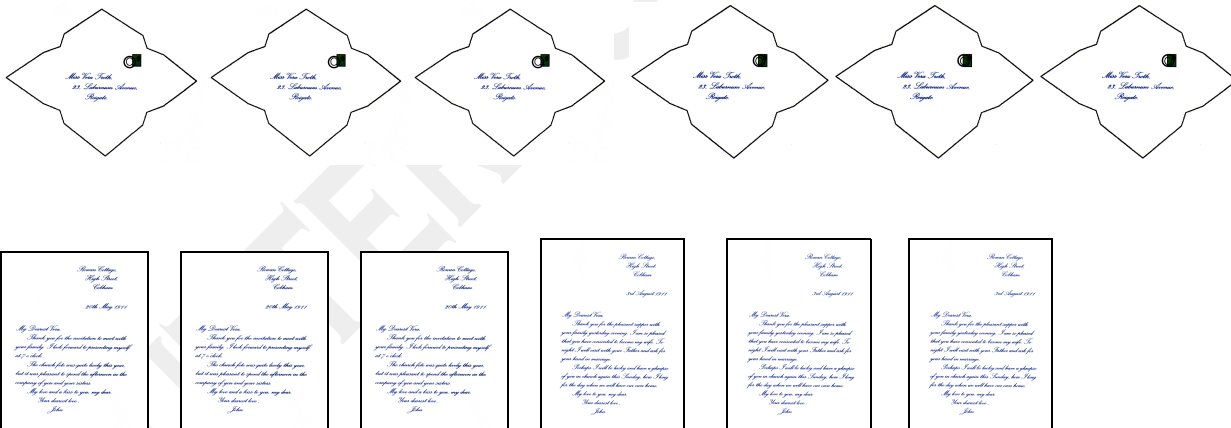
Please note letters shown above are 1:12th scale

Extra materials required:
Scissors, cocktail stick and paper glue.

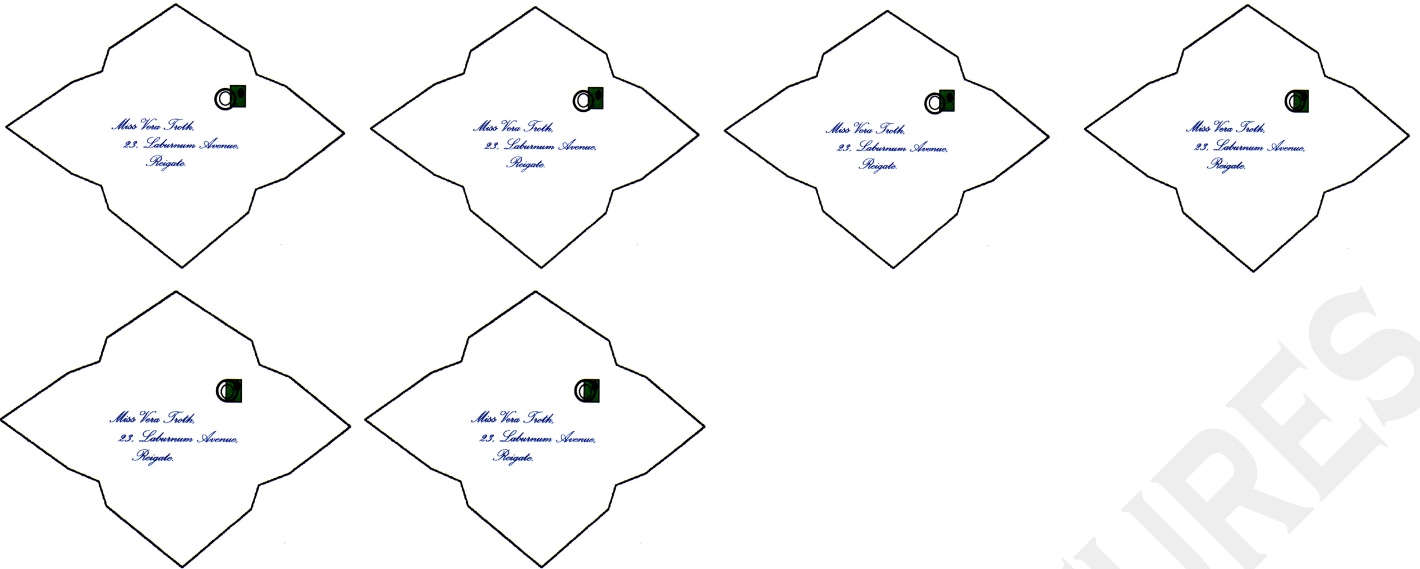
Instructions

1. Cut round one envelope.
2. Turn over and fold in side flaps.
3. Fold up bottom flap and glue along edges of bottom flap where it will touch side flaps, insert pointed end of cocktail stick carefully into corner and run gently along base of envelope to stop envelope from sticking together. Leave to dry.
4. Cut around letter and fold so that it will fit into the envelope. Place carefully into envelope.
5. Fold down top flap, tear along fold and glue along cut edges of top flap, stick this top flap to envelope to resemble an opened letter, insert cocktail stick into envelope as shown in Step 3. Let glue dry thoroughly.
6. The letter can be left in the envelope or displayed separately.
7. Make up other letters in the same way.
